The Meeting of the Pennsauken Township Committee was held on Wednesday, January 27, 2016 in the Caucus Room at the Pennsauken Township Municipal Building, 5605 N. Crescent Blvd. Pennsauken, NJ 08110.

The Meeting came to order at 5:30 PM by Mayor Kneib who called for the roll call which was recorded as such:

Resolution No. 2016:113

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PENNSAUKEN AUTHORIZING THE PAYMENT OF PETTY CASH TO THE PENNSAUKEN FIRE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-21 authorizes the payment of Petty Cash Fund to the Pennsauken Fire Department; and. WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Township of Pennsauken, of Camden, County of Camden to have such a fund for the Pennsauken Fire Department in the amount of \$ 400.00: and

WHEREAS, the custodian of this fund is Joseph Palumbo, Chief of the Fire Department, who is bonded for the amount of \$ 400.00; such custodian shall maintain records for this fund in a manner conducive to proper accounting and auditing procedures;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken hereby authorizes such action and that two copies of this resolution to be filed with Township of Pennsauken Finance Office and the Pennsauken Fire Department.

Resolution No. 2016:114

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PENNSAUKEN TO ESTABLISH TWO BUS STOPS ON RIVER ROAD (CR 543)

BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken, County of Camden, State of New Jersey

That pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-8(e) the following described location is designated as a bus stop: County Road

- 1. Along River Road (CR543), westbound, on the northerly side thereof between:
 - Old River Road and Griffith- Morgan Lane- (Mid Block)
 Beginning 260 feet west of the northerly curbline of Old River Road and extending 135 feet westerly therefrom.
- 2. Along River Road (CR 543), eastbound, on the southerly side thereof between:
 - Old River Road and Griffith Morgan Lane (Mid Block)
 Beginning 260 feet west of the prolongation of the northerly curbline of Old River Road and extending 135 feet westerly therefrom.

That the Mayor and the Township Committee of the Township of Pennsauken will enforce the needed traffic regulations governing the aforementioned bus stop location and provide the necessary police security to ensure the safety of the traveling public.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Diane Johnson -45^{th} Street asked if the trash pick-up has been delayed due to the snow? The entire streets trash had not been picked up on Monday.

Administrator Grochowski replied that a revers 911 call had gone out on Friday afternoon to remind residents NOT to put their trash in the driveways, but that trash would be picked up on regular pick up days. Mr. Scavuzzo Director of Public Works was present and stated it would be taken care of.

<u>Committeeman Killion</u> – Thanked Public Works for a job well done during this record snow fall/blizzard. He commented that they (Bd of Education) and Public Works had worked together during the height of the snow fall and what a pleasure it was. Everything was done professionally.

Resolution No. 2016:115

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A CLOSED SESSION OF THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PENNSAUKEN TO DISCUSS A MATTER OF CONTRACTS (Rt. 130)
